### Furniture/Equipment

- CAD software (Modacad, Betacad)
- computer(s) with printer, software and plotter
- Dell Optiplex 270 or current Dell with Windows capability
- computerized sewing machine(s)
- sewing machines and machine stools/chairs
- cutting tables
- dust buster; whisk broom; lint brush
- ladder/stools (adjustable)
- mannequin(s)
- sergers
- dress forms
- male dress form

### Materials

- alteration tags; piecework tickets
- assortment of price tickets
- color wheel; personal coloring chart; color collars
- fashion magazines, newspaper ads, and trade journals
- policy and procedure manuals from large fashion or fabric stores
- price conversion charts
- sample purchase orders; packing slips; invoices

### Sewing Materials/Supplies

- 1/2 scale dress form
- cutting tools: snips; buttonhole scissors; 7" shears; 10" bent trimmer shears; 7" and 10 1/2" pinking shears; seam ripper; nippers
- hand sewing aids: assorted thread; needles (#8 for all-purpose, #9 or #10 for fine handwork); machine needles; thimbles; bobbins and bobbin cases
- holding tools: straight pins and pin cushion; adhesive basting tape; fabric glue stick
- marking tools: marking chalk, marking pencils; hem marker; soap
- measuring tools: tape measure; stitch and seam measurer; seam gauge yardstick
- misc. sewing aids: awl; fashion figure; croquet; dress form; fitting platform; full length mirror; rolling clothes rack with hangers
- muslin and samples of interfacings

### **Sewing Materials/Supplies (con't)**

- nippers
- pressing equipment: steam and dry irons; pressing and ironing boards; Tailor's ham and seam roll; sleeve board; pressing cloth; steamer/steam machine

### **Sketching Materials**

- eraser: kneaded clay (will not leave marks or shavings)
- outlining; colored pencils for a grid or sectioning the figure
- paint brushes
- paper: pads (9" x 12" or 11" x 14"); tracing paper; sketching vellum; layout bond
- pencils: 2B or 4B for darker line; 4H or 6H for lighter underline; ebony for
- pens: fine point marker for sharp outline; any color pens
- ruler: clear plastic ruler (easy to see through as you rule)
- water colors
